The Pulaski and Sandy Creek Central School Districts have partnered together in order to develop a School-to-Work Program for the benefit of students and community members from both districts.

The School-to-Work Program is designed to help junior and senior students transition from school to the working environment. The STW program will be tailored to meet the needs of individual students.

Students enrolled in this program will be required to first complete the classroom component. During this time, students will learn how to explore and research their career choices, fill out job applications, write a cover letter, develop their resume, and learn tips and techniques for a successful job interview. They will then be placed in work sites directly related to their career.

Work sites are currently being established in the Watertown and Syracuse areas and all points in between. Collaboratives have already been established with the House of the Good Samaritan hospital, Salmon Run Mall, Pascale's Restaurant, New York State Troopers, Laboratory Alliance, South Jefferson Central School District and the Pulaski Day Care Center.

Students in the STW program will complete 54 hours of classroom instruction and 108 hours of related training at various worksites/internships. Each student who successfully completes the program will receive 1 unit of credit toward graduation. There are paid and non-paid experiences available.
